With this in mind, the event was restructured from the traditional course choice evening to a much more interactive event. Our S3 into S4 Learner Pathways evening allowed pupils and parents to talk with employers, teachers, further and higher education providers and ask any specific questions.

We also had two presentations on the evening one form Ernst Young and the other was a STEM activity called 'People like me' aimed at Girls run by STEM ambassadors.

The World Challenge group who are planning a trip to Sub-Saharan Africa provided teas/coffees/cakes in the dining hall with Music will provided by AGS pupils.

Artwork from pupils in the Junior Phase was also on display.

Overall the event was very successful with positive feedback from all involved.







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EY and Aberdeen Grammar School aim to inspire with partnership

Inspiring and encouraging young people to consider a variety of pathways into careers in business is on the agenda within an Aberdeen school as big four professional services firm EY enter into a flag-ship partnership with Aberdeen Grammar School.



Young people at the school will gain insight into the ways they can join EY (via their apprenticeship programme or graduate programme), will have the opportunity apply for the company's summer business academy and will get real life examples of the business world via a curricular link with the school's Business Studies department.

As a collaborative relationship EY will benefit from the opportunities to increase young people's awareness of EY and hope to recruit some of their future apprentices from the school.

Matthew Foster and Alan Martin, from Aberdeen Grammar School said: "We are delighted to work in partnership with EY along with DYW North East. It is also great to see former pupils as apprentices who are contributing to the partnership in delivering presentations to our senior phase pupils, this enables our current pupils to think on different routes available. Feedback from them already suggests that there has been a change in mind-set regarding their future pathways.

"It's also been good to work with EY as they have attended our Learner Pathways events for pupils and parents. We are looking forward to future and continued collaboration with our partners."

Hannah McArdle, Recruitment Advisor at EY said: Aberdeen Grammar is a great school which wants to ensure their students know that there is a range of career options out there. The school is supportive of the Apprenticeship route at EY being a suitable alternative to University. We have seen apprentices in previous years join our programme from this school and it is also in a good location for our business, where we welcome office visits from their students. We look forward to working in partnership with teachers, students and their parents at Aberdeen Grammar school."

Young people at the school have already taken part in a number of activities as part of the partnership, whereby three apprentices from EY presented to S6 pupils at the school to outline an alternative pathway into accountancy from the university route and the business attending the S3 pathways event which was held earlier this week.

S2 Network Rail Activity


The whole of the S2 year group took part in a DYW activity with Network Rail on Tuesday the 30th of January P3 & 4. This was run by four of their current graduates. One whom previously attended AGS.

The graduates spoke with the whole of the S6 year group during period one where they gave details of their chosen career pathways and also highlighted the various options from Graduate entry schemes to Apprenticeship schemes offered by Network rail.

Network rail have been looking to geographically expand the work they undertake with schools north of the central belt and have developed a railway themed STEM -in-a-box activity for the S2 year group. The activity highlighted possible career opportunities from apprenticeships to graduate schemes though three challenges. Network rail hope that pupils consider it as a potential career once they leave school.
