Please find below key updates for this week.

School Recovery Plan

The return to school requires detailed and careful planning. We will provide you with our School Recovery Plan and Parent Guide (Return to School) by the end of this term. This plan and guide will detail what blended learning (in-school and at-home learning) will comprise of for each year group. It will let you know the time your child will be in school and the arrangements for at-home learning.

I do not want to issue a plan until we have explored all possibilities around securing additional building space. The current social distancing rules mean that we have to apply the 2 metre rule. This means, for example, that a class of 30 pupils, normally accommodated in one room, will need to be spread across three rooms, with three members of staff. To exemplify further, we have 210 pupils in S1. Under normal circumstances, the year group is organised into 7 non-practical classes. With social distancing rules, we will have to run 21 classes. Our school roll remains consistently around 1100, which means that our school building is running at full capacity under normal circumstances.

In addition to this, the situation is constantly changing. I do not want to issue one plan next week and then change it by the end of term.

Clearly, we would all dearly love to be told that it is safe for us to return to school, as normal, in August. For the moment, we do need to have plans in place which adhere to social distancing rules and public health advice, as outlined in the Local Delivery Phasing Plan https://sway.office.com/Dd9pxR7RZF46vQek?ref=Link

Uniform

As stated above, you will be issued with a Parent Guide on a range of practical matters to help you and your child (children) prepare for return to school in August.

Our current advice regarding uniform for August, which was issued to our P7 parents last week, is as follows:

As John Lewis/Stevenson's remain closed, many parents have been unable to purchase a new School Blazer for their children. In addition, Scottish Government advice is that pupils wear clothes to school which are freshly laundered. For these reasons, we do not expect pupils to wear a School Blazer or School Tie in August.



We still expect pupils to dress appropriately for school and they should wear the required items indicated in the table below.

I am hearing from teaching staff that our pupils are showing signs of flagging a little as we approach the end of term. It has been very challenging for pupils and I am proud of the way that they have engaged with online learning. As I always say, pupils at AGS want to learn and value the education we provide. That said, attendance at 'live teaching' google meets has dropped a little. I would really appreciate it if you could encourage your child to continue attending Google meets. Teachers put a lot of time and effort into producing materials and present key teaching points during these meets.

I have advised staff not to post any new work in the last week of term in order to allow pupils to catch up on work already issued. Again, this decision is based on feedback from pupil groups. We will also need to use the last week of term to share with pupils what the return to school will look like in August. As I said, this may be subject to change, depending on the social distancing rules in August.

SQA - S4, S5 & S6 pupils

Many pupils have already registered with MySQA to receive their examination results by text or email. If they have not done so already, pupils should sign up at <u>www.mysqa.org.uk</u> before 5 pm on Tuesday 14 July 2020 and check that their contact details are correct. To register with MySQA, pupils require their Scottish Candidate Number (SCN) and a valid email address.

Should there be a change to their home address since school closure, pupils should contact their PTPS.
